Corinna Brunckhorst, MD, FESC is Professor of Cardiology and Co-Director of Electrophysiology at the University Heart Center in Zurich, Switzerland.

She was born in Freiburg, Germany, studied at medical schools in Hamburg, Munich and Berlin and graduated with full honors. In addition, she underwent clinical traineeships at the universities of Aberdeen, San Diego, Capetown, Sydney and Harvard Medical School. Thereafter, she passed the ECFMG American medical board exams. She completed her postgraduate training in Internal Medicine and Cardiology at the Free University Berlin and at the German Heart Center Berlin. For the following 2.5 years, she underwent a clinical and research electrophysiology fellowship at Brigham and Women's Hospital at Harvard Medical School in Boston. Since 2000 she is staff member at the University Hospital in Zurich, Switzerland. In 2007 she was appointed as Co-Director of Electrophysiology and Professor of Cardiology at the University Zurich.

Corinna Brunckhorst has published over 200 papers in international journals.

She is co-founder of the Swiss ARVC expertise center in Zurich. She is member of the Task Force on the Treatment of ARVC.

Her main interest focuses on treatment of arrhythmias, esp catheter ablations of ventricular tachycardias and arrhythmogenic right ventricular cardiomyopathies.

She is a member of AHA, ESC, EHRA and the Swiss Society of Cardiology and she serves as reviewer for all major cardiology journals.
